Hiking Bastrop State Park (Feb 5)



Hiking Wild Basin Preserve (Feb 6)



What a companionable group of hikers! Seven of us (CarolC, Evie, Jacque, KimH, LindaF, LindaW(1), and Marie) met at Wild Basin Preserve to walk, talk, and enjoy our lovely winter surroundings.

Evie and KimH offered to lead the hike; CarolC was nominated to be the official map reader (the one who can read small print). Someone (who recently enjoyed a class on mammals) suggested we focus on tracks and scat for this hike and the group agreed.

So we set off with our leaders in front selecting our route. We successfully arrived at the creek and falls where ice still decorated the rocks. The sounds from the creek were very enticing. LindaW(1) promptly tossed her sunglasses (or dropped by mistake – we voted) in the creek and challenged us to retrieve them. Of course we had to accept that challenge and did a bit of rock climbing. Then across the creek we marched; we returned across the creek and climb the hills to

our starting location. LindaF was particularly interested in the flora.

Trail runners preceded us, so any tracks we might have seen were lost. We debated over two samples of scat seen. We agreed the first sample was raccoon. The debate lingered over the second sample. So I submitted two photos to Mitch at Wild Basin who identified the scat as likely from a coyote and the plant at Evergreen sumac.

Evie believes she saw a ringtail cat prior to joining us, but so far the id is elusive.

If you plan to hike this area, print the flora handout from the website. Copies are unavailable at the trail head.

We walked 2.11 miles in 1:18. The terrain was challenging in some areas and level/easy in others. Afterward six hikers set off for Rudy's BBQ for lunch. It was a fun outing. Thanks everyone for attending!


